Dr. Walach Leads Drone Workshop at MSU

In October, Dr. Walach led a detailed 10-hour drone workshop for faculty, staff, and graduate students. This in-person training prepared participants to take the Federal Aviation Administration's Part 107 Remote Pilot exam, an essential piece for obtaining a commercial drone license. The Part 107 Certificate allows MSU researchers to utilize drones for data collection in their studies and facilitates commercial drone operations.

Dr. Walach, who serves part-time as the director of the BOREALIS lab—a NASA-funded research facility at MSU—looks forward to offering more opportunities like this in the future.
