Vice chairman Kirkegard called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.



CIRCLE MONTANA CITY GOVERNMENT STUDY COMMISSION FINAL REPORT

The City of Circle, Montana Government Study Commission elected by the voters on November 8, 1994, or thereafter appointed present this final report to the citizens of this city.


The purpose of the study commission, as defined in state law, is "to study the existing form and powers of our city government and procedures for delivery of local government services and compare them with other forms available under the laws of the state". If some change is deemed necessary, the study commission may submit such proposed change to the electors.

In the conduct of their review the study commission has sought advice and information from a number of people in the community. Opinions and recommendations were solicited from local government officials, community organizations and citizens. All meetings of the study commission were open to the public. Public hearings were held to determine citizen opinion.

As a result of discussions held with the people and groups mentioned the Circle City Study Commission has concluded that there is general consensus that the existing form of government has served this city well since the adoption became effective on May 2, 1977, and will continue to do so in the future. We therefore recommend no change in this form of government.


