- Comments about the minutes
 - Intentional Focus 2: This is really meant to increase the impact of research
 - Goal 2.1: Enhance the significance and impact of scholarship
 - I. The addition of Governance was liked among the group.
 - Goal 2.2: They didn't think expand interdisciplinary scholarship is promoted by dual appointments.
