Welcome and Introductions:

Voted for the next Research Council meeting on February 4th, 2026, to be in the Research Alliance.

MSU Research Information Items:

- Proposal: Applied Quantum CORE (QCORE) – Jayne Morrow & Krishna Rupavatharam
 - Give a high-level overview of establishing QCORE and need feedback from across campus
 - There are 31 MOUs of organizations to be the next generation of workers
 - Discuss developing a request to plan for center growth and expansion
 - Emphasize industry partnerships and workforce development in quantum computing.
 - Highlighted the unique infrastructure and resources available at Montana State University for quantum research.
 - Focus on transitioning research from Lab settings to practical field applications.

 - Introducing the team that uses space:

- Research Alliance fosters collaboration among campus groups to support faculty success and resource access.
- Monthly meetings enhance synergies and address challenges within the research community.
- Explore opportunities for broader participation, including staff and graduate students, in research initiatives.
- November 1 State of Research and Forecast—Alison Harmon
 - Optimistic outlook on submitted proposals, totaling 312 this year, with requests of \$163 million.
 - New awards decreased by 21% compared to last year, raising concerns about funding.
 - Expenditure increased by 27%, and IDC collection rose by 8% from last year.

Discussion Topic:

- Faculty Recruitment: Start-up Packages that include alternatives to cash
 - Develop a one-pager highlighting the benefits and resources for new faculty to accompany offer letters.
 - Explore the possibility of offering fellowships for graduate students to make the University more attractive to new faculty.
 - Faculty recruitment discussions emphasize the importance of showcasing MSU's unique resources and benefits.
 - Highlight lifestyle advantages and community engagement opportunities to attract new faculty.
 - Consider conducting a survey of current faculty to gather insights on what attracted them to MSU.

Research Policies and Procedures:

- Research Misconduct Policy—Kirk Lubick
 - Research Misconduct Policy was approved.
 - Human participant database update. Currently, there are up to 400 participants.
